Important Notes

1. **Grinder sizing:**
 - 1 - 4.5 bathrooms = 3ft simplex grinder
 - 5 - 10 bathrooms = duplex grinder

2. Grinder pump systems are payable only at the time of purchase. You may call the Warehouse @ 301-334-8382 to inquire about the current cost. That cost does not include installation by the contractor of choice.

3. **Inspection requirements:**

Contact Allan Cecil of Megco Inspections @ 240-381-6231 to schedule inspection of waterline and sewer line between house & grinder basin.

4. **Homeowner options for well** after connection to public water is made per the Garrett County Health Department:
 - a. If owner chooses to keep their well for non-potable uses such as car washing and lawn watering the well cannot be connected to any portion of the public water supply. The well must also be a useable water supply. This means that the pump in the well and components that make the well usable such as a pressure tank and separate faucet must be maintained.
 - b. If the owner does not want to maintain the well in a usable condition the well must be abandoned by a licensed well driller. The driller will submit the required abandonment documentation to the Health Department.
