




PJM Interconnection serves as the regional transmission organization (RTO) for a 243,417-square-mile area that covers all or parts of Delaware, Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Maryland, Michigan, New Jersey, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Virginia, West Virginia and the District of Columbia.

As an RTO, PJM plays a vital role in the U.S. electric system. PJM:

- Ensures the reliability of North America's largest centrally dispatched control area by managing the movement of electricity in its territory
- Operates the largest competitive wholesale electricity market in the world
- Plans generation and transmission expansion to ensure reliability
- Operates independently and neutrally
- Provides real-time information to its members and customers to support their decision-making

The scope of PJM's operations is extensive:

- Population – 61 million
- Generating sources – 1,376, with diverse fuel types
- Generating capacity – 183,604 megawatts
- Peak demand – 165,492 megawatts
- Annual energy delivery – 832 million megawatt-hours
- Transmission lines – 62,556 miles
- Members/customers – more than 800
- Cumulative billing – \$264 billion since 1997



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
