#### **BOARD MEETING MINUTES**

March 29, 2022

**4:00 PM-**Meeting was called to order and quorum determined by Lois Martin.

#### **APPROVAL OF MINUTES:**

The minutes for the March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022 meeting was approved on a motion made by Chuck Nolan, seconded by Randy Glotfelty and made unanimous by Lois Martin.

#### **ELECTION DIRECTOR REPORT:**

There were 79 new registrations and 175 removals for March 1<sup>st</sup> through March 28<sup>th</sup>, with 107 removals being due to the confirmation mail process. Active registered voters are as follows for Garrett County: Democrat – 3,766, Republican – 13,477, Green Party – 26, Libertarian – 94, Working Class – 19, Unaffiliated – 2,797, and other parties – 165, for a total of 20,344.

Steve has a Directors meeting every Thursday morning via Google Meets because of the everchanging events pertaining to the upcoming election.

The inventory is 97.4% completed.

#### **NEW BUSINESS AND CORRESPONDENCE:**

Steve presented to the Board the following information relating to the 2022 Gubernatorial Election:

## 1. Election Date Change

• The election date has been changed from June 28<sup>th</sup> until July 19<sup>th</sup> due to the court hearings that are in progress disputing the redistricting of congressional, senatorial, legislative and councilmanic districts throughout Maryland.

- On March 25<sup>th</sup> the Maryland Court of Appeals threw out the redistricting plan, stating that it is unconstitutional. The court ordered the General Assembly to submit a new map by March 30<sup>th</sup> to be heard by April 1<sup>st</sup>.
- On March 28<sup>th</sup> the Senate went into session and approved a new congressional map. It is posted on the legislative website.
- The Election Directors and State Board of Elections had an emergency meeting to discuss the new congressional map and the timeline needed to put this into action.
- Steve handed out the election schedule for the 2022 Gubernatorial Election which is subject to change.

# 2. <u>Vote Centers and Polling Places</u>

- Both early vote centers have accommodated the new election date.
- Steve has received confirmation on 10 of the 15 polling places. Of the remaining 5, 4 have not responded yet, and 1 cannot accommodate us on the new election date.
- The deadline to approve polling place changes is April 19<sup>th</sup>.
- 3. Candidacy Deadline has been extended to April 15<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 p.m.
- 4. We have processed 1134 mail-in ballot applications for the primary election.
- 5. Election Judges have all been contacted concerning the new election date.
- 6. Steve has received approval from the State Board of Elections on our Election Judge training manuals.
- 7. Election Judges training is scheduled for April 26<sup>th</sup> 28<sup>th</sup> and May 2<sup>nd</sup> for Chief Judges, and May 4<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup>-10<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> for Machine Judges.

Steve received a request to move the monthly board meeting back to 5:00 p.m. The board discussed the time change. Approval to move the board meeting to 5:00 p.m. was made on a motion by Jim Moore, seconded by Chuck Nolan and made unanimous by Lois Martin.

#### **ADJOURNMENT:**

The next board meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, May 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2022 at 5:00 p.m.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:40 p.m. on a motion by Randy Glotfelty, seconded by Chuck Nolan, and made unanimous by Lois Martin.
